




WHY A COURSE IN DIGITAL LITERACY?

- Importance of digital technology in the modern world
- As a digital learning college our students rely heavily on digital technology
- No explicit digital literacy instruction previously within library resources
- Hibernia College academic integrity CoP encourage proactive measures against academic misconduct
- Making it available as an OER is supportive of the SDGs, especially SDG 3, 4 and 8
- OER creation is also supportive of digital citizenship


HOW DID WE GO ABOUT I


- Chose the most important domains to cover by consulting digital literacy frameworks including DigComp, JISC and CAUL
- Made decisions around duration of lessons and quizzes, how much content to include and at what level
- Created the lessons in Articulate Rise in consultation with College learning and digital designers
- Initial internal feedback suggested the course was welcome and potentially useful for a variety of teaching scenarios
- Made available internally on the College VLE and more widely through our Digital repository (IASC) and OER Commons




WHAT DOES IT LOOK LIKE?

WHAT ELSE COULD WE DO?


The Five Rs of OERs (Wiley, 2014)

Redistribute: increase visibility and add to other OER registries

Reuse: integrate with other content in our programmes or deliver live

Revise: expand content to address other framework areas and AI

Remix: consider ways it could be used with other OERs
